

would like to cruise the city to see if they could find some women. Gacy drove around the city for awhile, but they could not locate any women. Gacy then began talking to the young man saying that there was more than one way for a man to have sex. Gacy said he did this in order to find out if this man may be bi-sexual. The young man responded to Gacy saying that two men could have sex. Gacy pretended to be ignorant not knowing what he was talking about. The young man responded to Gacy saying that there was no difference for a man to get a blow job from a man or from a woman; that it was all the same thing. After this statement, Gacy asked the young man if he would like to go to his home for a few drinks, to which he accepted and they proceeded to Gacy's house. Gacy then asked the young man if he would like to spend the night, to which he replied he would. Shortly thereafter they had sexual relations and then went to bed. Gacy then related that he woke up for some unknown reason in the morning and at that time when he did wake up, he found the young man to be coming at him with a knife. He struggled with the young man, got the knife from him and then stabbed him two or three times in the chest. The victim was then dead and he took him down into the crawl space and buried him. It was at a later time that he poured concrete over the spot where he buried the victim. Reporting Officer asked John Gacy if he knew what this man's name was, and he said he wasn't sure. He gave a name of possibly Randy or even possibly David. He was not sure.

Mr. Finder asked Gacy if he kept any tokens or mementos from his first victim, and he said no he didn't. That after that he didn't kill anybody for six months, because of his marriage.

Gacy then asked us if we had [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] under arrest at the station. We told him no and asked Gacy why and Gacy said that they were his accomplices. Reporting Officer asked Gacy if they had any part in any of the killings, Gacy did not answer that question directly, but rather started talking about having sexual relations on numerous occasions with both of these people. He also indicated that [REDACTED] was a pusher and a pimp. Gacy said that [REDACTED] would make contacts for him, because he could supply his young people with drugs. Gacy then said that [REDACTED]'s father had committed murder once, but had never been arrested for it. When asked by Reporting Officer, Gacy did not know who the victim had been. Mr. Finder then asked Gacy the specifics of how [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had been involved in the killings. Gacy indicated that because of his heart condition, he had [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] did the trenches in the crawl space. Reporting Officer then asked if one or both had ever been involved with burying a victim, or handling the bodies in any way. Gacy indicated they had not, but had only dug the trenches. Gacy was then asked if [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had known what was in the crawl space. Gacy replied that they never said anything to him about what was in the crawl space, but if they didn't know what was down there, they were fucking stupid. Gacy was then asked about the odor that was in the crawl space. He replied that some of the odor was not caused by the bodies, but by the dampness in the crawl space. Gacy indicated that he put lime in the crawl space to get rid of the dampness. He said he put a muriatic acid on the bodies to dissolve them at a faster pace.

Reporting Officer then asked Gacy if he had had bi-sexual relations with a man while he was married; to which he answered affirmatively. He also said that he met a lot of his sexual partners, some of which were victims, in an area called Bug House Square. Gacy indicated that he was able to have his relationships at his home, because his wife would often at times leave for the evening, spend the night at a friend's, or leave the home and go to an area in Minnesota.

Mr. Finder or myself then asked Gacy about the Szyc boy. Gacy said that he remembered him and also remembered that he spelled his name in a very unusual manner. Gacy said he felt that Szyc was rather strange in some of the things that he liked to do.

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Gacy then rather abruptly said that Szyc was in the crawl space. I asked Gacy if he kept anything of any kind of a memento from Szyc and he answered affirmatively, saying he kept a ring.

Reporting Officer then asked Gacy if he could explain where the bodies were in the crawl space. He tried to describe it and was having a difficult time in telling us exactly where the bodies were buried and asked if he could draw us a diagram. I supplied Gacy with a pen and a pink sheet of paper. Gacy at first couldn't get the pen to work and made a comment on the lousy pen I had given him. He then drew a diagram of the house, showing where the crawl space entrance was and explaining by drawing a short line where each body was. Also making a point of showing where the first victim had been buried and put under some concrete. Gacy drew the first half of the diagram very neatly and explained to us in great detail what he was drawing. Just prior to finishing his sketch, Gacy became very tense and clenched his fists very tightly and closed his eyes. He remained in this position for about 30 seconds. After Gacy relaxed his body, he looked at us and then we told him to take it easy and get some rest. Gacy then looked at the sketch he had just drawn and said that that was a sketch of his crawl space and showed where the bodies were; that Jack must have drawn it. At this time I took the pen and paper from Gacy, told him to get some rest and that we would be back later to talk to him. Gacy then became very apologetic, asking what did he say and what did he do wrong and why we had to leave him. We replied to him to get some rest and take it easy and that we would be back to talk to him later. At this time Mr. Finder and myself left the cell block area.

Mr. Finder and myself proceeded back to the Detective Section of the police station, where we were met by Assistant State's Attorney Bill Ward. In his possession he had two pictures of victims that had been taken from the Des Plaines River in Will County. He asked us if we would show these pictures to Gacy to see if he could identify the people. We returned to the cell area and spoke to Mr. Gacy, showed him the pictures; one of the pictures being that of a Frank Landegen. Gacy looked at the Landegen picture, said that he recognized that subject knowing him from a bar in Franklin Park. I asked him if that was one of his victims, and he said no I don't think so. Gacy indicated that the other subject was not familiar to him at all.
